Analytics cookies

Analytics cookies may be used to collect anonymised and aggregated information about how visitors use the website, such as pages visited and time spent on the site. This information is used solely for the purpose of improving the website and its content and does not identify individual users.

Third-party cookies

Some pages on the website may include content or services provided by third parties. These third parties may set their own cookies, which are subject to their own privacy and cookies policies and are outside the control of the school.

Managing Cookies

Users can control and manage cookies through their web browser settings. Most browsers allow users to view cookies stored on their device, delete cookies, or block cookies from specific or all websites.
